



Submission Requirements

Information for Authors Who Wish to Submit Articles for *Biofeedback*

Items for inclusion in *Biofeedback* should be forwarded to biofeedbackeditor@gmail.com. Material must be in publishable form upon submission.

Deadlines for receipt of materials will be communicated by the Guest Editor for Special Issues. For general submissions, please submit when you're ready; the editors will contact you when peer review is complete and let you know if the article is accepted and what issue it is planned for.

Articles should be of general interest to the AAPB membership, informative and factually based. The editor reserves the right to accept or reject any material and to make editorial and copy changes as deemed necessary.

Feature articles should ideally not exceed 2,500 words; department articles, 700 words; and letters to the editor, 250 words. Manuscripts should be submitted by email in Microsoft Word or GoogleDocs files, together with instructions on any special text formatting. Do not include special formatting in the document itself – it should be in simple text, with headings bolded.

Authors may have their article considered for BCIA continuing education credits; contact BCIA for more information.

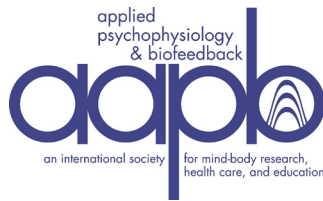

Format Requirements

1. Articles should be in American Psychological Association (7th Edition) format. Pay particular attention to the citations and reference list requirements, which are different from previous editions of the APA Style Manual.
2. Articles should be double-spaced, 650 to 2,500 words long (though longer articles may be accepted). They should include an abstract of about 80 words, and up to 5 keywords. A running head (short version of the title) should be suggested.
3. Provide city/state and main professional affiliation information for each author, and a complete physical address, with an email address that accepts attachments, for the corresponding author. Correspondence information for one author will be printed with the article; you may include a phone number if desired.
4. Provide a headshot of each author, scanned and sent as a jpg, or png file of 200 dpi or greater. Name the file with the author's full name.
5. Articles should be journalistic, telling the story of an application, research topic, or treatment approach in terms that any college graduate should be able to understand.
6. Keep tables and figures to a minimum (see APA 7 for information on when to include them and how to prepare them). Figures should be submitted separately as files of 200 dpi or greater. Provide a list of captions for all figures after the references; do not embed captions in figures.



7. If using or adapting figures or tables from another source, get permission from the original publisher, and provide complete citation information from the original source. If using a photo of an identifiable person, get a written release with permission to use it in print.
8. Please submit the article via email to biofeedbackeditor@gmail.com as a Word or GoogleDocs document. Submit only previously unpublished work. You will have a chance to make corrections to proofs. Proofs and copyright permission forms must be returned within 72 hours to ensure publication in the next available issue.
